



District-reported 2002 results

- On average, each teacher earned an additional \$3,190 in compensation.
- Monies also paid for extended school days, Saturday school, summer school, and academic tutoring, as well as staff development, related services, and supplies.
- Teachers and instructional assistants were hired to reduce class sizes.
- About 750 teachers accomplished performance goals based on individual performance evaluations and grade and school improvement on standardized test scores.
