



District-reported 2002 results

- On average, each teacher earned an additional \$1,866 in compensation.
- Teachers earned additional performance pay, which was distributed in fiscal year 2003, based on test scores and professional development accomplishments.
- Standardized test scores at most schools increased by 5 points or more, on average, in reading, math, and language.
- Most teachers completed professional development goals.
