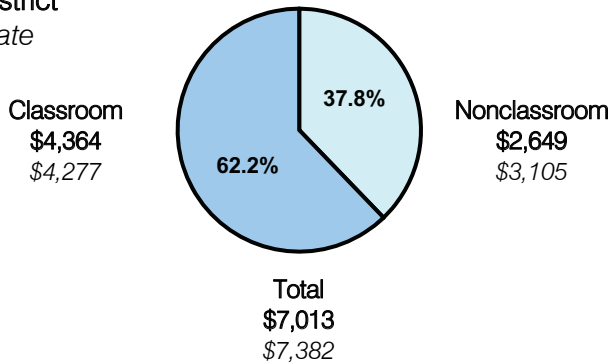

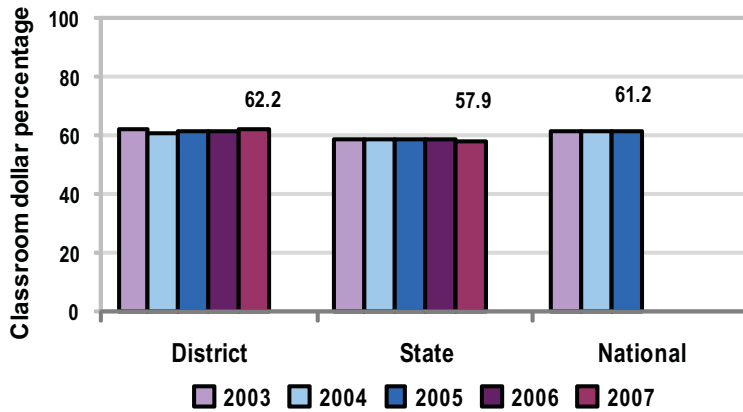

### Proposition 301

#### District-reported 2007 results

##### Teacher pay

- On average, each teacher and librarian earned an additional \$4,841 in salary, which includes performance pay for fiscal year 2006 performance.

##### Performance

- The District accomplished some of its goals, which were measured based on fiscal year 2006 school performance.
- 4 student achievement goals were linked to students' standardized test scores. Only 1 of these goals was met.
- Each school achieved at least a 95 percent attendance rate each day during AIMS testing.
- Teachers could earn money by earning an English As a Second Language endorsement.

##### Menu

- Monies were used primarily to increase eligible employee compensation.
- Approximately 3,500 students were provided AIMS intervention activities focused on improving reading and math skills.
- Approximately 2,200 8th-grade students received additional tutoring to prepare them for high school placement testing.
- Teachers attended professional development programs focused on improving students' AIMS test results.
