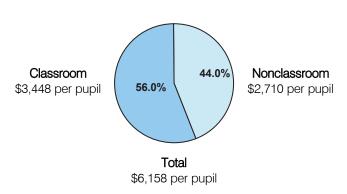

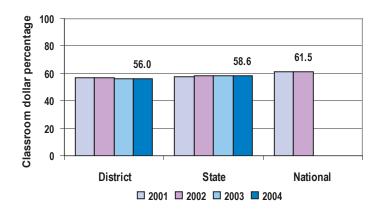

District-reported 2004 results

Teacher pay

 On average, each teacher, librarian, speech pathologist, and audiologist earned an additional \$3,838 in salary, and each counselor and teacher on assignment earned an additional \$4,152.

Performance

- The District accomplished most of its goals, which were based on individual performance.
- Most eligible employees received acceptable performance evaluations in 17 areas.

Menu

- Monies were primarily used to increase eligible employee compensation.
- 1 school added a science class to reduce class sizes by 4 students.
- AIMS intervention activities included hiring teachers and instructional aides to assess students in reading, math, and language and to provide feedback to schools. According to the District, these activities helped increase students' AIMS test scores.
- Teachers were hired to tutor students with behavioral problems to reduce suspensions, ensure students receive continued instruction, and enable teachers to better maintain order in regular classrooms.
- Teachers were also compensated for attending professional development programs.
