



Proposition 301 expenditures were 1.10 percent of the District's \$5,906,821 current operating expenditures in fiscal year 2002.

#### District-reported 2002 results

- On average, each teacher earned an additional \$1,500 in salary.
- Teachers earned performance pay for such things as perfect attendance, graduate-level course work, student attendance rates, and students' reading scores. They were also compensated for tuition and books, recertification, and fingerprinting expenses.
