



Teacher pay

 On average, each teacher, librarian, speech pathologist, audiologist, and counselor earned an additional \$3,414 in salary.

Performance

- The District accomplished most of its goals, which were based on school and individual performance.
- Goals were linked to student achievement on standardized tests, meeting adequate yearly progress goals, and earning or maintaining school accreditation.
- Other goals called for 95 percent student attendance and for teachers to miss 5 or fewer days of work.
- Teachers were also required to complete professional development classes, increase contact with parents, participate in leadership activities, and tutor students.

Menu

- 6 physical education teachers and 6 counselors were hired
- Monies were also used to pay a portion of eligible employee health insurance premiums and to establish a tuition reimbursement program.
