


#### 5-year spending trend (2010 through 2015)

Total operational spending per pupil, adjusted for inflation, decreased by 12 percent. The percentage of dollars spent in the classroom varied year to year, ranging overall from a high of 52.6 to a low of 50.5 percent. As a percentage of total operational spending, plant operations increased substantially, while most nonclassroom areas remained fairly stable.


# Administrative cost per student




# Total operational and instructional spending per student (inflation adjusted to 2015 dollars)




# Plant cost per square foot and square footage per student




## Changes in operational spending percentages
