





### Proposition 301

#### District-reported 2004 results

##### Teacher pay

- On average, each teacher earned an additional \$3,540 in salary, and each librarian, counselor, and English Language Learner coordinator earned an additional \$2,665 to \$2,909.

##### Performance

- The District accomplished most of its goals, which were based on district and individual performance.
- Elementary-school students' reading and math test scores increased and middle-school students' reading tests scores increased.
- Elementary-school teachers devoted 45 minutes each day to teaching test preparation skills.
- Teachers encouraged increased student attendance through home visits, telephone contacts, and incentives. Middle-school attendance increased by 1 percent.
- 34 percent of teachers met teacher attendance goals, and 88 percent received acceptable performance evaluations.
- 22 teachers participated in leadership activities.
- Most elementary-school teachers established a personal performance goal.

##### Menu
