




#### 5-year spending trend (2010 through 2015)

Total operational spending per pupil, adjusted for inflation, returned to 2010 levels. The percentage of dollars spent in the classroom varied year to year, decreasing overall from 53.3 to 50.4 percent. As a percentage of total operational spending, student support increased substantially and administration and instruction support increased. Transportation decreased, while plant operations and food service varied year to year.


# Total operational and instructional spending per student (inflation adjusted to 2015 dollars)




# Changes in operational spending percentages






#### Administrative cost per student
