



Teacher pay

 On average, each teacher earned between \$1,847 and \$2,880 in additional salary.

Performance

- The District accomplished its goals, which were based on school and individual performance.
- Students were required to demonstrate 1 year's academic progress, and teachers were required to receive satisfactory performance evaluations.
- Teachers also encouraged parental involvement through quarterly newsletters, by inviting parents to board meetings, and by sponsoring activities such as family night, science night, poetry night, and exercise classes.

Menu

 Monies were used to compensate teachers for working additional hours outside of the regular school day. Teachers earned monies for activities such as tutoring, supervising after-school activities and overnight field trips, making home visits, and working on committees.
