





District-reported 2004 results

Teacher pay

- On average, each teacher earned an additional \$4,632 in salary.

Performance

- High-school teachers aligned curricula to state standards, developed student achievement goals each semester for each class, and were evaluated on writing and math assignments developed for students.
- High-school teachers also met goals associated with North Central Accreditation, including analyzing data, developing mission and goal statements, and establishing a school improvement plan.
- Elementary-school teachers established a school improvement plan, analyzed AIMS and standardized test scores to identify student weaknesses, set grade-level goals for improvement, and developed assignments, projects, activities, and assessments to address the goals.
- Average standardized test scores for students in grades 2 through 8 increased by at least 4 percent in 2 of 3 areas, which included reading, writing, and math.
